American Indian Community Housing Organization is a nonprofit organization located in Duluth MN. AICHO provides a wide range of services to people who are homeless and victims of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking and trafficking. This includes a domestic violence shelter, permanent supportive housing, and community based legal and housing advocacy. AICHO's funding is diverse, including the following federal sources: The Office of Violence Against Women, VOCA, Community Development Block Grant, Emergency Shelter Grant, Administration for Native Americans, and HUD. HUD has experience in developing housing and programming to support victims of domestic violence, our current DV shelter houses 150 women/children annually and turns away 500 due to lack of space. In addition to shelter services, AICHO provides community based legal services, rapid rehousing, children's programming and also has Hearth vouchers for scattered site housing for 35 homeless families and 29 units of permanent supportive housing and 10 units of affordable market rate housing, 95% of the residents in our PSH units are victims of domestic violence. AICHO has been providing shelter and support services, including housing search to victims of domestic violence since 1993 and is currently expanding its shelter beds from 10 to 24. Since 2005, AICHO has been receiving Hearth vouchers to both provide housing subsidies and intensive case management services to homeless individuals and families, case managers work with landlords to find find safe, affordable housing and work to quickly move people from streets and shelter into permanent housing. Since 2012, AICHO has successfully provided 29 units of permanent, supportive housing to homeless families. AICHO staff are trained in housing first; trauma informed care and cultural competency.

AICHO's annual budget is 2.4 million with over 25 funding streams, including many federal, state, local and private sector funds. Case Managers will meet regularly to assess needs and help with reducing barriers to obtaining and maintaining housing.

AICHO will provide comprehensive programming to help participants to increase their employment and income - we will refer to local job training programs as well as local educational programs, we will assist participants with any fees associated with these programs as well as transportation and childcare. Case managers will meet with participants to set self-defined goals for schooling and or employment and will meet regularly with the participants to assist them in meeting their goals. AICHO also is developing in-house job

training and employment opportunities for participants that will be up and running by October 2019, this include coffee shops, art gallery/gift shop and local food market. Case Managers will also assist participants with accessing resources to increase their income, until they can find adequate employment, this may include assistance with applying for benefits including GA, TANF and SSI.

Outreach will be conducted directly with domestic violence victim/survivors who access the two domestic violence emergency shelters in Duluth: Dabinoo'lgan and Safe Haven. AICHO operates Dabinoo'lgan, a 10-bed domestic violence shelter, which currently provides shelter stays to a minimum of 150 individuals annually, with an additional 500 requests for services (turnaways due to shelter at full capacity). AICHO is currently purchasing a larger building that will expand its shelter beds from 10 to 24. AICHO will coordinate resources and services with Safe Haven domestic violence emergency shelter. AICHO will market available project resources and services to local and regional domestic violence and community advocacy organizations. AICHO will use direct communication, written materials, and groups to let potential participants know of the project and resources available. In addition, AIHO has long-standing service coordination with local homeless shelter and housing providers.
