
ACT & T-ACT is a person-centered, comprehensive community-based practice that provides integrated treatment, rehabilitation, and support to individuals diagnosed with a Serious and Persistent Mental Illness. Services are delivered a minimum of 2-3 days a week by an interdisciplinary team of providers. The team is mobile, provides services seven days a week, and is available for crisis response 24 hours a day.
