Time Specific Presentation

Chair Jugovich noted that Commissioners toured the Bois Forte Heritage Center and Cultural Museum last night.

At 10:41 a.m., Sarah Carling, Community and Business Development Specialist, Community and Economic Development Associates, and Megan Christianson, Executive Director, Visit Grand Rapids, gave a presentation to the Committee regarding the Northern Minnesota Historical Mine Tour project. Ms. Carling said that the ask of St. Louis County is \$100,000.

Central Management & Intergovernmental Committee

Grimm/Boyle moved that the St. Louis County Board accepts the diversity, equity and inclusion strategic planning services proposal submitted by the Center for Economic Inclusion of St. Paul, Minnesota, in the amount of \$149,200 and authorizes the appropriate county officials to enter into an agreement with the Center for Economic Inclusion for consulting services. [21-311]. Director of Human Resources and Administration Jim Gottschald said that Public Health and Human Services has been a leader and formed an inclusion group in 1995. In 2020, County Administration established a Diversity, Equity and Inclusion (DEI) Leadership Group made up of department heads and high-level managers.

The DEI group was joined by members of the Black, Indigenous, and People of Color (BIPOC) peer support group. After a request for quotes was conducted, it is recommended that the Board approve the agreement with the Center for Economic Inclusion in the amount of \$149,200. The following members of the DEI and BIPOC groups addressed the Board: St Louis County Public Records and Property Valuation Director Mary Garness commended members for having the courage to share their stories. Mike Valdez, of Public Health and Human Services, thanked the Board for their support and acknowledged speakers for attending the meeting and sharing their stories. John Staine, of the Assessor's Office, commented that this work is important to him and likes seeing representation. Tonia Villegas, of Public Health and Human Services, said that she is a White Mexican and people assume they know you based on the way you look. Ms. Villegas discussed people making negative comments about Black, Mexican, and Native American people because they thought she was White. Ida Watson-Souther, of Public Health and Human Services, said that it has been difficult; people have looked down on her or told her that they do not want to work with her based on her skin color. Ms. Watson-Souther commented that we need to dismantle and start over because nothing has changed. Jennifer Reyes, of County Administration, said that the Center for Economic Inclusion will benefit and bring knowledge to the community and will give employees the opportunity to serve communities better. Mike Valdez introduced consultants from the Center for Economic Inclusion: De'Vonna Pittman, Director of Inclusion Growth; Samuel Ndely II, Director of Employer Inclusivity; Michael Aromolaran, Vice President of Impact & Accountability; Cay Kimbrell, Employer Inclusivity Principal Consultant; Tony Tolliver, Senior Director of Strategic Partnerships; and Genesis Sudderth, Consulting Coordinator. Ms. Pittman gave the Board a brief presentation regarding the Center for Economic Inclusion's approach and scope of services. After further discussion, the motion passed. (6-0, Jewell absent)

Nelson/Jugovich moved that the St. Louis County Board hereby appoints Tom Coombe to its Board of Adjustment for the remainder of a term ending December 31, 2023. [21-312]. The motion passed. (6-0, Jewell absent)

RELATED DEPARTMENT GOAL:

Children will be born healthy, live a life free from abuse and neglect, and will have a permanent living arrangement. Adults will live in the least restrictive living arrangement that meets their health and safety needs.

ACTION REQUESTED:

Authorize the St. Louis County Continuum of Care (CoC) to apply for Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program (YHDP) funds as the collaborative applicant. Funds awarded will range from \$1 million to \$15 million for a two-year grant cycle and support youth led community work focused on systems change to end youth homelessness.

BACKGROUND:

The FY 2019 and 2020 YHDP Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for rounds four and five grant funds was published on May 24, 2021. St. Louis County CoC has led numerous information and feedback sessions to identify the gaps and needs that could be supported through this funding source.

HUD will select up to 50 communities to participate in the YHDP to develop and execute a coordinated community approach to preventing and ending youth homelessness. Eight of the 50 selected communities must be rural communities (St. Louis County CoC is designated as a rural community).

If approved, St. Louis County CoC will apply as a Collaborative Applicant which will also include a youth action board, representation from St. Louis County Children and Family Services and a broad array of other partners.

Funding awarded to those selected will range from \$1 million to \$15 million per community based on each community's youth population size and poverty rate. The grant period will be a two-year term that will be eligible for future renewal.

The purpose of the NOFO is to implement projects that will significantly reduce youth homelessness for youth up to age 24. This includes unaccompanied and pregnant or parenting youth. The work of this grant will be youth led and focused on systems change to end youth homelessness.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the board authorize the St. Louis County CoC to apply as a Collaborative Applicant for the HUD Youth Homelessness Demonstration Project grant for up to \$15 million for a two-year grant cycle.

Request to Apply for HUD Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program Funds

WHEREAS, Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has released the FY 2019 and 2020 Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program (YHDP) Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for rounds four and five grant funds which was published on May 24, 2021 and will select up to 50 communities to participate in the YHDP to develop and execute a coordinated community approach to preventing and ending youth homelessness; and

WHEREAS, Funding awarded to those selected will range from \$1 million to \$15 million per community based on each community's youth population size and poverty rate; and

WHEREAS, The St. Louis County Continuum of Care would be the collaborative applicant and administer the funds; and

WHEREAS, The funding would be utilized to implement projects that will significantly reduce youth homelessness for youth up to age 24 including unaccompanied and pregnant or parenting youth and the work of this grant will be youth led and focused on systems change to end youth homelessness;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the St. Louis County Board authorizes the Public Health and Human Services Department to accept grant funds in the amount of up to \$15 million from HUD for a two-year grant cycle with the opportunity for renewal.

RELATED DEPARTMENT GOALS:

Children will be born healthy, live a life free from abuse and neglect, and will have a permanent living arrangement. Adults will live in the least restrictive living arrangement that meets their health and safety needs.

ACTION REQUESTED:

The St. Louis County Board is requested to authorize the Public Health and Human Services Department (PHHS) to accept grant funds of \$395,850 from the Department of Human Services Housing and Support Services Division to develop community living infrastructure for a grant term of two years, from July 1, 2021 until June 30, 2023.

BACKGROUND:

In 2017, the Minnesota Legislature passed a comprehensive housing package adding language to the Housing Supports Act to increase and improve opportunities for Minnesotans with disabling conditions to live in the community. The goals outlined in this grant opportunity merge the collective efforts outlined in Minnesota's Olmstead Plan and Minnesota's Plan to End Homelessness.

St. Louis County received \$256,175 for this initial grant for the period of June 2018 to June 2019. DHS has since amended its contract with St. Louis County PHHS to reimburse up to \$519,175 for services rendered until the current grant period concludes on June 30, 2021.

On March 23, 2021, the County Board passed Board Resolution No. 21-198, allowing St. Louis County Public Health and Human Services to apply for continued CLI grant

funds for FY21-23. St. Louis County was notified of its award of \$395,850 for the 2021-2023 grant cycle with a possible extension of up to five years.

This grant funding will continue to cover the cost of 1.0 FTE initially funded with the grant (G0350-001), and funds for two partner agencies, Range Transitional Housing in northern and Human Development Center in southern St. Louis County to do the work.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the St. Louis County Board authorize the Public Health and Human Services Department to accept funds of \$395,850 from the Department of Human Services Housing and Support Services Division to continue development of community living infrastructure for the period July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2023 with the possible extension of up to five years.

This continues the grant funded position added with the initial grant award, G0350-001 and funds for two partner agencies in northern and southern St. Louis County that are part of the work plan.

Acceptance of MN DHS Housing and Support Services Grant to Develop Community Living Infrastructure

WHEREAS, The Minnesota Department of Human Services (DHS) Housing and Support Services Community Living Infrastructure awards grant funds to counties to increase and improve opportunities for Minnesotans with disabling conditions to live in the community; and

WHEREAS, The goals merge the collective efforts outlined in Minnesota's Olmstead Plan and Minnesota's Plan to End Homelessness; and

WHEREAS, St. Louis County has had grant funding for these efforts since July 1, 2018 including funding for 1.0 FTE Homeless and Housing Program Specialist (Position Code G030-001); and

WHEREAS, The St. Louis County Board approved the application for CLI grant funds on March 23, 2021 through Board Resolution No. 21-198;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the St. Louis County Board authorizes the Public Health and Human Services Department to accept grant funds in the amount of \$395,850 from the Minnesota Department of Human Services Housing and Supports and Services Division for the 2021-2023 grant cycle including continued funding of Position Code G030-001, to enter into agreements with community partners, and to increase the 2021 revenue and expense budget to reflect the awarded amount, with any unspent funds to be carried over into the 2022 and 2023 grant cycle.

Bruce Alan Housey and Paula Schaefbauer of Aurora, MN, contract for deed holders, have made application to repurchase this property and are eligible to repurchase the property. 

On May 6, 2021 Bruce Housey and Paula Schaefbauer submitted an application and payment for the repurchase of State Tax Forfeited Land, legally described as the SE ¼ of the NW 1/4, Sec 32 Twp 57 Rge 15 (570-0012-04400). Conditions of this repurchase include resolution of any state, county or municipal code violations within 60 days. These actions include:

- Meeting Ordinance-62-Zoning-Amended-2016, Section 6.25 Inoperable Vehicles Storage Administrative Standards "C" guidelines (see exhibit A)
- Meeting Ordinance-62-Zoning-Amended-2016, Section 6.27 Salvage Facility Standards Conditional Use Standards "C" guidelines (see exhibit B)
- the removal and proper disposal of abandoned personal property and blight
- inspection and approval of the on-site wastewater treatment system

Periodic site inspections between January 16 and June 3, 2021 by Land and Minerals staff reveal the repurchasing party has not met the required compliance standards with state, county or municipal code on this property. The SLC Sheriff deputy blight officer also performed an inspection of the property on June 6, 2021, and informed the applicants of the need for ordinance compliance. Therefore, it is in the best interest of the rural Aurora community of White Township, and St. Louis County to cancel this repurchase contract, should any state, county or municipal code violations not be corrected within 60 days of the Board approval.

Ordinance-62-Zoning-Amended-2016

Section 6.25 Inoperable Vehicles Storage Administrative Standards "C"

- A. No Permit Required: Minimum Standards: No permit shall be required for the storage of unlicensed or inoperable vehicles on property if the following standards are met:
- 1. All stored vehicles shall meet the principal structure setback requirements of the zone district in which they are located.
- 2. All stored vehicles shall meet the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency standards for motor vehicle environmental compliance.
- 3. If the vehicles are stored on shoreland property, the parcel shall be 2.5 acres or larger in size and vehicles shall be stored 300 feet or greater from the shoreline.
- 4. There shall be no more than five unlicensed or inoperable vehicles on a parcel, unless the vehicles are screened from ordinary public view and all standards above are met.






Section 6.27 Salvage Facility Standards Conditional Use Standards "C"

- A. Permit Required: Minimum Standards: All salvage facilities under the jurisdiction of this ordinance shall meet the following minimum standards. These standards shall apply to all salvage facilities regardless of the year of salvage facility establishment. A new salvage facility requires a conditional use permit if allowed in the land use district where it is located with the following standards:
- 1. Wetland Conservation Act requirements shall be followed.
- 2. All salvage facilities shall have a minimum property line and road setback of 100 feet. No activity except fencing, berms, or other screening may take place in the setback area.
- 3. No salvage facility shall be allowed within 300 feet of a protected water.
- 4. All waste including batteries, tires and hazardous waste shall be kept on the property in a manner acceptable to the appropriate solid waste authority or disposed of in a manner acceptable to the county and state and federal regulations.
- 5. A record shall be kept of all salvage material and waste brought in and out of the property.
- 6. The local fire department shall be notified of all flammable and hazardous material stored on the property including: amounts, types, and location.
- 7. Fire breaks and roads shall be approved by the local fire department.
- 8. The salvage facility shall conform to all St. Louis County sewage treatment standards.
- 9. The salvage facility shall conform to all the standards for wells of the State Health Department including the sealing of abandoned wells.
- 10. Access to the site shall be obtained from the appropriate road authority.

















ACTION REQUESTED:

The St. Louis County Board is requested to authorize the reclassification of state tax forfeited lands as non-conservation.

BACKGROUND:

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 282.01, Subd. 1, all parcels of land becoming the property of the State of Minnesota in Trust, through forfeiture, for nonpayment of real estate taxes shall be classified or reclassified as conservation or non-conservation.

The parcels described in the attached list forfeited to the State of Minnesota for nonpayment of real estate taxes and were previously classified as conservation. The Land and Minerals Department has determined that the parcels are suitable for private ownership and is recommending that they be reclassified as non-conservation. The reclassification must be approved by the municipality or town which has 60 days in which to weigh in on the reclassification. Parcels located in the city of Duluth have been reviewed by city staff.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the St. Louis County Board reclassify the described state tax forfeited parcels as non-conservation.

Reclassification of State Tax Forfeited Lands to Non-Conservation

BY COMMISSIONER	

WHEREAS, All parcels of land becoming the property of the State of Minnesota in Trust through forfeiture for nonpayment of real estate taxes shall be classified or reclassified as conservation or non-conservation as required by Minn. Stat. § 282.01, Subd. 1; and

WHEREAS, The parcels described in the attached County Board File forfeited to the State of Minnesota for nonpayment of real estate taxes and were previously classified as conservation; and

WHEREAS, The St. Louis County Land and Minerals Department has recommended that the parcels be reclassified as non-conservation after considering, among other things, the present use of adjacent land, the productivity of the soil, the character of forest or other growth, the accessibility of lands to established roads, schools, utilities and other public services, and their peculiar suitability or desirability for particular uses; and

WHEREAS, These parcels of land may be located inside the boundaries of a municipality or town and Minn. Stat. § 282.01 provides that classification or reclassification and sale of lands situated within a municipality or town must be approved by the governing body of the municipality or town; and

WHEREAS, The town or municipality is considered to have approved the classification or reclassification and sale of these parcels if the county board is not notified of the disapproval of the classification or reclassification and sale within 60 days of the date the request for approval was transmitted to the town or municipality in which the parcels are located;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the state tax forfeited parcels described in County Board File No._____ shall be reclassified as non-conservation, and the request for approval of the reclassification shall be transmitted by the St. Louis County Land and Minerals Department to the clerk of the municipality or town in which the parcels are located;

RELATED DEPARTMENT GOAL:

To perform public services.

ACTION REQUESTED:

The St. Louis County Board is requested to consider a request for a free conveyance of state tax forfeited property to St. Louis County for the potential development of an integrated waste management facility.

BACKGROUND:

On July 27, 2021, St. Louis County, acting as a political subdivision of the state of Minnesota, is expected to approve a resolution requesting a free conveyance of approximately 800 acres of state tax forfeited land for use in connection with a potential integrated waste management facility in Canyon.

The St. Louis County Board, acting as the administrator of state tax forfeited lands, must consider this request for a free conveyance. The documents supporting the request will be provided at the August 3, 2021 regular board meeting.

Pursuant to Minn. Stat § 282.01, Subd. 1a(e), non-conservation state tax forfeited land may be conveyed by the Commissioner of Revenue to a governmental subdivision for an authorized public use with the favorable recommendation of the County Board. All property conveyed under a conditional use deed by the Commissioner of Revenue pursuant to this statutory provision is released from the use restriction and the possibility of reversion 30 years from the date the deed is acknowledged.

All 800 acres of requested land are currently classified as conservation and designated as memorial forest lands. Thus, to be eligible for conveyance, the land must be reclassified as non-conservation and withdrawn from the memorial forest.

State tax forfeited land which has been included in an established memorial forest and found more suitable for other purposes may be withdrawn from the memorial forest if the Commissioner of Natural Resources approves the sale of such land. Additionally, conservation land may be reclassified as non-conservation land and conveyed if the County Board determines the land is more suitable for purposes other than forest management.

The Land and Minerals Department has determined, after considering many factors including the present use of adjacent land, the productivity of the soil, the character of forest or other growth, the accessibility of lands to established roads, schools, and other public services, the suitability or desirability for particular uses and the suitability of the forest resources on the land for multiple use and sustained yield management, that all 800 requested acres would be more suitable for purposes other than forest management and supports the free conveyance.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the St. Louis County Board approve St. Louis County's request for a free conveyance subject to payment of \$250 Department of Revenue fee, \$250 administrative fee, \$25 deed fee and \$1.65 deed tax; for a total of \$526.65.

Request for Free Conveyance of State Tax Forfeited Land to St. Louis County

WHEREAS, The Land and Minerals Department recommends that these parcels be reclassified as non-conservation after considering many factors including the present use of adjacent land, the productivity of the soil, the character of forest or other growth, the accessibility of lands to established roads, schools, and other public services, the suitability or desirability for particular uses and the suitability of the forest resources on the land for multiple use and sustained yield management; and

WHEREAS, These parcels are located inside the boundaries of a municipality or town and Minn. Stat. § 282.01 provides that notice of the classification or reclassification of lands situated within a municipality or town must be transmitted to its governing body; and



THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the state tax forfeited parcels described herein shall be reclassified as non-conservation, and the request for approval of the reclassification shall be transmitted by the St. Louis County Land and Minerals Department to the clerk of the municipality or town in which the parcels are located;

RESOLVED FURTHER, The reclassification of these parcels will be deemed approved if the county board does not receive notice of the municipality's or town's disapproval of the reclassification of any parcel within 60 days of the date on which this resolution is delivered to the clerk of the municipality or town;

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the state tax forfeited parcels described herein shall be withdrawn from Memorial Forest status if the Commissioner of Natural Resources approves the sale of such land;

RESOLVED FURTHER, That, upon reclassification as non-conservation and withdrawal from memorial forest status, the St. Louis County Board recommends that the Commissioner of Revenue convey the state forfeited land described in County Board File No._____ to St. Louis County for an integrated waste management facility, upon payment of \$250 Department of Revenue fee, \$250 administrative fee, \$25 deed fee and \$1.65 deed tax; for a total of \$526.65.







RELATED DEPARTMENT GOAL:

Children will be born healthy, live a life free from abuse and neglect, and will have a permanent living arrangement. Adults will live in the least restrictive living arrangement that meets their health and safety needs.

ACTION REQUESTED:

The St. Louis County Board is requested to invest and distribute up to \$5,183,159 in 2021-2024 American Recovery Act funds through its Public Health and Human Services (PHHS) Department to support school districts within St. Louis County to reengage students and get them back on track for academic success following the pandemic.

BACKGROUND:

St. Louis County has been awarded approximately \$54,000,000 in American Rescue Plan Act funds for COVID Response, Recovery, Revenue Replacement and Infrastructure expenses for the period beginning March 3, 2021 through December 31, 2024. As Public Health and Human Services has worked with Commissioners, Administration and partners across health, education and non-profit sectors throughout the pandemic conversations move from COVID Response to COVID Recovery. This Federal funding is intended to meet local needs, prioritize households, individuals and communities hardest hit by the crisis and lay the groundwork for an equitable recovery.

A critical need identified throughout the pandemic has been education. Over the course of the COVID-19 pandemic, Minnesota schools, and schools throughout St. Louis County, moved between various learning models. For some students, these new learning pathways worked well. For many students, however, the changes in learning modalities along with the other pressures and challenges adversely impacted their education. School districts around St. Louis County have reported that many students stopped attending, were unresponsive to outreach, fell behind in grades and credits, and some were unenrolled.

In an effort to proactively invest in COVID recovery, St. Louis County Public Health and Human Services (PHHS) has proposed a significant portion of COVID American Rescue Plan (ARPA) funds to invest in a proven program that is designed to get students back on track for academic success. PHHS is aware that the tools we have at our disposal for Educational Neglect reports through the Child Protection System or Truancy reports through the court system is insufficient to meet the significant challenges ahead during this COVID recovery period. PHHS collaborated with school districts throughout the county to assess the need and determine an effective solution, together, selecting the MN-based, evidenced-based model *Check & Connect*.

Check & Connect is an intervention used for more than 30 years with K-12 students who show warning signs of disengagement with school and who are at risk of dropping out. At the core of Check & Connect is a trusting relationship between the student and a caring, trained mentor who both advocates for and challenges the student to keep education salient. Students are referred to Check & Connect when they show warning signs of disengaging from school, such as poor attendance, behavioral issues, and/or low grades.

A multidisciplinary team of individuals from PHHS have worked on a comprehensive solicitation, application and selection process using the *Check & Connect* intervention model as a framework for contracting to meet the goals of the St. Louis County Student Reengagement Initiative.

- After extensive outreach and collaboration, an informational session with St. Louis County PHHS, Check & Connect was held Wednesday, June 23, 2021 with all Districts invited; and
- An email announcing the RFP opportunity was emailed Friday, June 25 to all attendees and Districts, with a deadline of July 6, 2021 for response.
- Respondents provided a narrative documenting the needs of their students and schools, their plan and level of proposed engagement with Check & Connect and a budget for the mentor positions they will add.
- All requests were funded in this proposal at level and budget requested.

It is important to note that not all districts responded to the solicitation to participate in this opportunity. Three chose not to apply and one district (Floodwood) requested to defer their application a year. Other districts or schools may decide to opt in or adjust their level of participation, and an additional \$120,000 has been set aside for that purpose.

We believe that the thoughtful and intentional intervention of 36.5 mentors across St. Louis County engaging with over 1,000 students at risk each year over three school years will be the difference we need to get kids back on track following the pandemic.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the St. Louis County Board invest and distribute up to \$5,183,159 in 2021-2024 American Recovery Act funds through its Public Health and Human Services (PHHS) Department to support school districts and individual schools within St. Louis County to reengage students and get them back on track for academic success following the pandemic.

It is also recommended that the Board authorize PHHS to enter into contracts with the University of Minnesota to provide *Check & Connect* implementation and management (training, program coordination, evaluation, coaching, technical support), and selected school districts and individual schools within St. Louis County for three years of funding to support mentors and coordinators beginning August, 2021 through August, 2024 as follows:

RELATED DEPARTMENT GOAL:

To manage the county's fiscal sponsored grants in an efficient and cost-effective manner to ensure success in their designated public use.

ACTION REQUESTED:

The St. Louis County Board is requested to consider a \$1,200,000 grant request to the St. Louis County Agricultural Fair Association for the construction of two new buildings on the fairgrounds in Chisholm, Minnesota.

BACKGROUND:

The St. Louis County Fair is a 137-year-old event and has been held over a decade in Chisholm. It is one of the ten largest County fairs in the state of Minnesota and is referenced as the FIVE BEST DAYS OF SUMMER.

The Fair is proposing an approximate \$1,200,000 improvement project including the construction of two new buildings. Building one is a 60x200 cattle, sheep, goat & swine barn and the second a 60x100 rabbit, poultry & small animal building. The structures currently being used for the display of these animals is inadequate. The Fair currently rents tents to house these exhibits—forcing the Fair to use a large portion of its annual funding to pay for these annual expenses. Building permanent structures would allow the Fair to offer a better way for fairgoers to view and interact with the animals—providing a more positive hands-on learning experience. The completion of this project will enable the St. Louis County Agricultural Fair Association to continue to offer educational opportunities through its animal exhibits—enabling over 20,000 annual visitors to learn the importance and impact of agriculture in everyday life. Permanent structures would not only create a more comfortable environment for the animals, but also improve the safety for both animals and fairgoers.

The St. Louis County Agricultural Fair Association supports agriculture education for both members of 4-H and the general public. The last few years, the St. Louis County Fair has been experiencing an increase in animal exhibitors. Having newer, more permanent

exhibit buildings that met the needs of the animals and fairgoers would enable the Fair to accommodate larger number of animals and visitors. Increases in attendance further support local vendors at the Fair—providing them with more exposure, which could potentially lead to more economic growth in northeastern Minnesota.

The County previously supported and included this project as part of its 2020 and 2022 Capital Appropriation request to the State of Minnesota. The County most recently specifically requested \$600,000 with the assumption that the Fair would identify other sources for the remaining project monies. The Association has indicated that it hopes to move forward with this project prior to the completion of the 2022 Legislative session and as a result is seeking County assistance with the project(s).

RECOMMENDATION:

Should the St. Louis County Board support the request for funding from the St. Louis County Agricultural Fair Association, it is recommended that the St. Louis County Board approve up to \$1,200,000 in one-time grant funding to be used for the construction of two buildings at the fairgrounds in Chisholm, Minnesota and further authorize the County Administrator and County Attorney to execute appropriate agreements.

WHEREAS, The St. Louis County Agricultural Fair Association (Association) has identified significant improvements necessary to its facilities located in Chisholm, MN; and

WHEREAS, The County has previously provided assistance for certain projects at the fairgrounds resulting in increased attendance and economic opportunities in the region; and

WHEREAS, The County has a commitment to its 4-H programs and the resulting positive hands-on experiences these programs provide our youth; and

WHEREAS, The provision of funding as requested is expected to be the last and final need for funding capital improvements at the Fairgrounds.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That St. Louis County approves a grant in the amount up to \$1,200,000 to the St. Louis County Agricultural Fair Association for the purposes of constructing new buildings at the St. Louis County Fairgrounds in Chisholm, MN.

RESOLVED FURTHER, That these funds be used exclusively for the construction of a cattle, sheep, goat & swine barn and rabbit, poultry & small animal buildings.

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the County Administrator and County Attorney are authorized to negotiate and execute appropriate agreements payable from Fund 403, Object 403002 or if determined eligible by the County and prioritized by the County Board from American Rescue Plan (ARPA) funds or from other fund savings as a result of the County's receipt of ARPA funds.

RELATED DEPARTMENT GOAL:

To assist the county to meet and negotiate with employees in appropriate bargaining units and reduce the negotiations to a written agreement.

ACTION REQUESTED:

It is requested that the St. Louis County Board approve the 2020-2022 Deputy Sheriff contract and authorize execution of the agreement with the Law Enforcement Labor Services (LELS).

BACKGROUND:

The Deputy Sheriff unit is comprised of 77 employees who work in the Sheriff's Department. The County's labor agreement with the Deputy Sheriff unit expired December 31, 2019. St. Louis County and LELS engaged in Interest Arbitration with the Minnesota Bureau of Mediation Services, to determine the terms of agreement of a new collective bargaining agreement effective January 1, 2020, through December 31, 2022.

The arbitration award includes across the board increases of: 2.00% effective December 21, 2019; 2.25% effective December 19, 2020, and 2.25% effective December 18, 2021.

Effective January 1, 2020, a change in the cost sharing premium structure for St. Louis County's self-insured health plan. The cost sharing arrangement for single coverage includes the employer paying 91% of the premium and the employee paying 9%. For family coverage, the cost sharing arrangement includes the employer paying 82% of the premium and the employee paying 18%.

Other economic items include: effective December 18, 2021 a change in the length of service to receive longevity pay, this will be implemented with a phased in approach.

Other language changes include: employees' sick leave has been expanded to Sick and Parental Leave, where employees are allowed to use up to 3 weeks of paid sick leave for bonding purposes for the birth or adoption of a child(ren); an employee's probationary period can be extended up to 24 months to accommodate approved leaves and work accommodations.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the St. Louis County Board ratify the 2020-2022 Deputy Sheriff Unit Collective Bargaining Agreement and authorize the appropriate county officials to execute a written agreement with Law Enforcement Labor Services consistent with the arbitration award.
