Department updates	Commissioner Boyle is board chair; Commissioner Jewel is PHHS chair; federal shut-down impacts: USDA is furloughed, SNAP (food stamps) is impacted and counties had an accelerated timeline for recipients to receive benefits through Feb.; IHS communities are vulnerable to the shutdown based on funding; Bois Forte is concerned; WIC funded through April; Homeless program grants – lack support services for administering these grants and coordination; PHHS will be interviewing for Division Director for Adult Services – Waiver programs; splitting Adult Services Division into Behavioral Health/substance Abuse/Adult protection/housing and homelessness and Division for Home and Community-based Services (waivers);
